## Parish Charter and Chapter Registry Guide

This guide will aid in moving through the process of chartering a parish chapter of the Fraternity of St. Joseph (FSJ).

The mission of our relational Fraternity is to build up a band of brothers, journeymen of all ages, in the just model of St. Joseph, who strengthen each other through fellowship, prayer, the Holy Mass, and the sacraments. Successfully handing on the deposit of faith to future generations of Catholics is our focus.

Choose from one of the two options below for initial contact with the FSJ Guiding Council. Upon submission of the appropriate form, the Guiding Council will share all of the support and resources needed to successfully create a parish chapter of the Fraternity over the one-year chartering period.

 FSJ Chapter Pastor Consent Form - A first step for parishes with a limited number of men interested in chartering a chapter. With the pastor's approval, the submission of this form provides an official notice of intent for the Guiding Council and will prompt access to the resources needed to encourage men of the parish to get involved.

The Pastor Consent Form, is a one-sheet form created for men wanting to start a parish chapter, to be used in the initial conversation with the parish pastor. It provides a first look at what a chapter offers to the life of the parish (relational, resources, tools of reach).

2) FSJ Chapter Registry Application - If your parish already has a sufficient number of men to assume officer positions, use this form as the initial contact with the Guiding Council. This one-sheet form is created for parishes that have enough men in place to start a chapter. Please note, officer vacancies are expected in the start-up year.

The Chapter Registry Application is used when a parish has assembled a group of men, known to the pastor to be in good standing with the Catholic Church, and who want to petition to start a chapter.

On this form, submit the total number of men involved into two categories:

1. <u>Consecrated Members (CM)</u>: Men consecrated to Mary first, then Joseph.

(Note: Consecration is not required to start a chapter but is strongly encouraged.)

2. <u>Members in Good Standing (MGS)</u>: Men not yet consecrated

With the pastor's approval, the chapter registry request will be submitted to the Guiding Council. The Fraternity registry will then be updated to reflect that this parish has now become a chapter of the Fraternity of St. Joseph.

All men listed on this form are encouraged to read the FSJ code of conduct, mission and vision statements.

With the pastor's consent, the individual shown below as the parish contact can send this form to the Guiding Council as official notice of chapter intent. Your parish will then receive all of the resources needed to start the process of encouraging the men of the parish to get involved and to support your chapter's charter year.

Submission of this form expresses to the FSJ Guiding Council that the parish has a sufficient number of men in place to assume officer positions and to establish a chapter with the pastor's consent.

The Fraternity Parish Charter will be conducted over a one-year period. This time is allotted for the officer positions of the parish chapter to be filled and for the men of the parish to come together in the just model of St. Joseph as Journeymen of Joseph. All prospective journeymen are encouraged to read at a minimum the FSJ code of conduct, mission and vision statements.

This form includes the names of the officers in place and indicates the number of journeymen in the following categories: those in Good Standing with the Church (as deemed by the pastor) and those Consecrated to Mary first, then Joseph.

It is the work of the Fraternity to move its journeymen from "In Good Standing" to "Consecrated" in an effort to expose fellow journeymen to the richness of the Catholic faith experienced first hand in the process of consecration. As Catholic men, we are taught to place our families first. In this awareness, and through the just model of St. Joseph, all Journeymen of Joseph are encouraged to first consecrate themselves to Mother Mary, then to St. Joseph, as they both lead us to Jesus in our consecration to the Holy Family.
